

The Lord be with you.

As you may know, I am in Liberia to continue the work the Lord has called us to. Since my arrival on the 9th of January, 2018, I have been in and around Monrovia, and Cape Mount County. Our cars were shipped and we are hoping they would arrive at the port on the 23 of February, 2018. There would be additional days to allow for clearance from the port.

I was at the national council meeting in Cape Mount County. The council, following a review of the current construction status of the Sanniquillie Church, decided to postpone the convocation to April 26-29, 2018 to allow the church to prepare the hosting venue. The council also created one new region as a strategy to expand the church towards the South Eastern parts of Liberia. The council also establish the office of "assistant for ministry" to allow the deans to work effectively without the burden of handling national ministry matters.

The convocation, the hosting, the execution, and other essentials necessary for a successful implementations are being planned with the national council and the convocation committee. Other national church administration, fiscal operation, and ministry matter are being taught to members of the regional and national church leadership.

As I write, funds have been provided for the continuation of the construction of the Sanniquillie church, the host of the convocation. The work is ongoing and progress is great. I was at the Dwazon church in Margibi to raise funds for the continuation of the construction of the church expansion. The construction is progressing and the church will have additional space to host the church growth.

The Nagbena church has made significant progress with the construction of the church and school. The primary infrastructural is completed but the cosmetic finishes are yet to be done. With the grace of God, these items would be progressively completed.

Work on the strengthening of the Brewerville church is being done. This will allow us to use this church as the gateway to reaching the mid-western and central-northern parts of Liberia.

We have made part payments of the tuition and registration for one of the pastors in training. When additional resources are available, the tuition would be completed.

I have met with a church that has expressed interest to be a part of Victory Ministry, seeking to be in fellowship, affiliation with, and learning and preaching Christ and His message based on our doctrine and practices. The modalities, technical and other legal documents are being worked out. The dean of this area, the assistant for ministry, and the nearest pastor of Victory Ministry are working with the church on providing a progressive teaching of what Victory Ministry believes and teaches before the full documentation is enacted.

I am making plans to go into Guinea when I arrive in Nimba. Please pray for us for a successful and Gospel is preached, a church is started without hindrances.

A forty-foot container was shipped from Salisbury, NC with the cars for the ministry use. It also had additional electronics, PA system, clothing, shoes, food items, and other essentials for humanitarian assistance.

I will update you other new developments as the possibility for my travel to the interior is made possible. It is extremely costly to continue to rent cars for travels, especially when these cars are not allowed to travel out of the paved roads.
