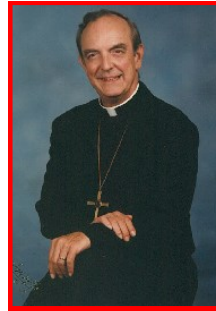


The Rev. Dr. Robert W. Jenson

August 2, 1930 – September 5, 2017

The Rev. Dr. Robert W. Jenson of blessed memory was a teacher and leader of upwards of four generations of pastors and theologians – in Carl Braaten’s words, “a Lutheran systematic theologian without equal in the history of American Lutheranism.” After earning his doctorate at the University of Heidelberg, Germany, Dr. Jenson taught at multiple Lutheran institutions, including Luther College (Decorah, IA), the Lutheran School of Theology in Gettysburg (Gettysburg, PA) and St. Olaf College (Northfield, MN). He also co-founded the Center for Catholic and Evangelical Theology and published its journal, *Pro Ecclesia*, with Carl Braaten. In the final years of his career, he focused on ecumenical studies as Senior Scholar for Research at Princeton Seminary’s Center for Theological Inquiry.

Dr. Jenson’s extensive works continue to serve as indispensable textbooks in the study of orthodox systematic theology and Lutheran confessional doctrine. “If I were on a desert island,” Braaten reflects *in memoriam*, “and had to choose just one theologian to teach me the beliefs and practices of the Christian religion, I could do no better than ask for copies of the complete bibliography of Robert Jenson. Soli Deo gloria!”



The Rev. Dr. Michael C.D. McDaniel (1929 -2003) of blessed memory served as bishop of the North Carolina Synod of the former LCA from 1982 to 1987 and then of the ELCA from 1988 to 1991. Prior to his episcopal call, Bishop McDaniel served as a parish pastor and then from 1971 to 1982 as a professor of religion and philosophy at Lenoir-Rhyne College in Hickory, NC. The Carolinas Mission District is proud to honor Bishop McDaniel’s lifelong commitment to orthodoxy and ecumenism with this annual Reformation conference. We come together as confessional Christians to do theology for the sake of the church – in Bishop McDaniel’s words, in order to “enhance our common witness to Christ”.

Ordained a Lutheran minister in 1978 in a predecessor body of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, his published books include a systematic theology, *Beloved Community* and the newly released *Luther for Evangelicals: A Reintroduction*.
